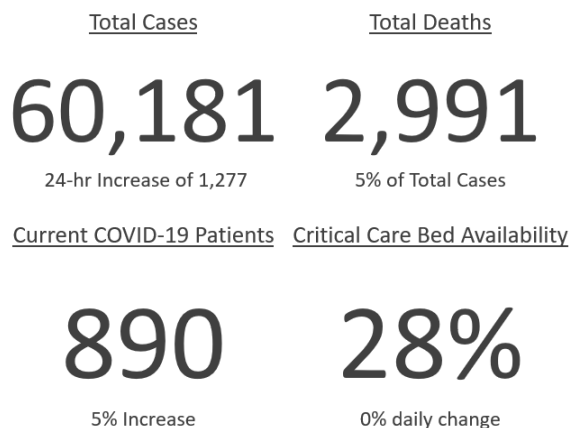
Executive Summary

Over the past 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 1,277 (60,181) total new cases, 106 (8,489) hospitalizations, 26 (2,127) ICU Admissions, and 21 (2,991) deaths, all of which are above their respective 21-day averages.

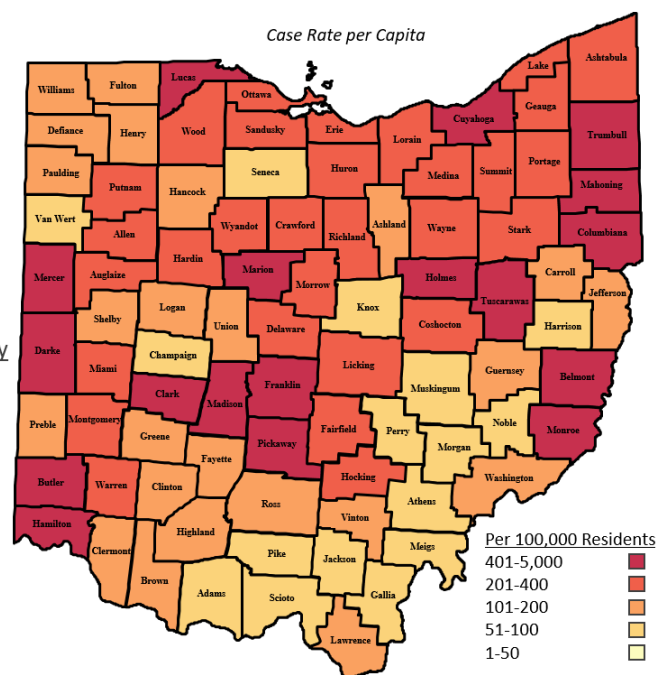
No new hot spots have been identified in the last 24 hours by ODH.

Warehouse capacity continues to be monitored as inbound supplies increase. State stockpiling and storage strategies continue to be developed through ESF-7 and the State EOC Unified Command.

State Community Lifeline Status

In-state Response | Ongoing External Support | Assistance Needed

Primary Lifeline



- Total confirmed cases, deaths, and hospitalizations continue to increase.
- 7-day moving average of case by onset date steadily increased from mid-June to early July.
- Positivity rate has increased slightly since late June; rate has remained between 4-6% since May.
- Reproduction number is now ranging between 1.03-1.12 in the three clinical zones.
- ED visits in mid-June show an increase; COVID diagnoses and total bed use continue to increase.
- Limited access to nursing homes & similar facilities continues.
- Personal Protective Equipment, Mass Fatality, and Medical Surge workgroups continue efforts.
- One RRF remains in-progress; 12 addressed and are no longer active.



- The Agriculture workgroup continues to monitor for issues of concern.
- All major pork processing plants impacting Ohio's processing are operating (statewide & nationally).
- Pork depopulation planning continues on account of processing interruption.
- Restaurants are open per the ODH Dine Safe Ohio Order (current as of May 21)
- Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues.
- [Potential quarantine locations](#) have been identified.
- Homelessness workgroup continues to update plans for response.



- First Responders have access to information on who has tested positive for COVID-19.
- Limited access to jails & detention facilities continues.
- ODRC staff and incarcerated populations continue to test positive across their statewide facilities.



- No current impacts to the lifeline requiring EOC support.



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State EOC Objectives

1. Coordinate the State's response to limit COVID-19 spread and maintain Lifeline stability.
2. Provide mission support to identify, prevent, mitigate and respond to COVID-19 hot spots.
3. Develop PPE procurement, warehousing, and allotment strategies to meet current and projected needs.
4. Share timely, clear, and consistent information to the whole community, especially as it pertains to recovery programs.

8 | Public Health

- Ohio Department of Health

Actions Taken:

- During this operational period ESF-8 Desk has initiated one mission requests today with State partners.
- ODH with Ohio EMA and the Federal COVID- 19 Response Assistance Field Team (CRAFT) met with community stakeholders in Dayton/West Central Ohio to determine possible root causes of the COVID-19 spike and to assist local government in designing a plan of action that will immediately reduce the impact of the virus; the CRAFT team is tasked to leverage the ground situation; validate data of what is happening; and understand community needs to mitigate COVID risk.
- ODH Warehouse in conjunction with ESF-1 (Transportation) executed 22nd PPE Push of 131 pallets containing 336,000 provider gowns to 43 primary county drop sites starting at 8:00AM.

Planned Actions:

- Will conduct ESF-8 Partners Meeting tomorrow.
- Continue to collaborate on daily RFIs and planning efforts with federal and state stakeholders and ESF-8 partners to provide guidance and direct information..

- Ohio Mental Health and Addiction Services

Actions Taken:

- OhioMHAS is continuing to monitor the behavioral health care services in state regional hospitals and in the county ADAMHS board areas for any impact to consumers and service providers due to COVID-19.
- Providers and boards are in receipt of public service information from ODH, CDC and state and local public health and response partners to reduce the risk of COVID-19 infections.

- Department of Aging and State Long-Term Care Ombudsman

Actions Taken:

- ODA launched the Staying Healthy Ohio Small-Business Restaurant Initiative. The initiative supports local restaurants with economic relief to provide home-delivered meals to older Ohioans. The initiative is supported with CARES Act funds

Planned Actions:

- ODA and the Ombudsman will participate in the ESF-8 Partner Planning Session.

- Ohio Department of Education

Planned Actions:

- Continue to develop new and update existing resources for schools regarding re-opening on the Department's Reset and Restart webpage (<http://education.ohio.gov/Topics/Reset-and-Restart>).

11 | Agriculture

Actions Taken:

- The Pork Industry Small Working Group met today. Although there are not reported disruptions in meat processing facilities, back up of hogs on Ohio farms will continue for the next few months.
- The group will continue to monitor and prepare for any unexpected disruptions that could result in a depopulation of livestock.

Planned Actions:

- Continue to monitor and support as needed.

13 | Law Enforcement

- Ohio State Highway Patrol

Actions Taken:

- Provided site security for the Ohio Department of Health. Provided perimeter security for the Trumbull Correctional Institution.

Planned Actions:

- Provide site security for the Ohio Department of Health.
- Provide perimeter security for the Trumbull Correctional Institution.
- Distribute food and provide traffic control at the Shiloh-Plymouth Food Pantry in Richland County.

- Assist with the delivery of meals to senior adults in Preble County.
- Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction
 - Actions Taken:*
 - Continues to work towards incident objectives.
 - Planned Actions:*
 - Has 838 staff COVID-19 positive, 703 staff recovered, 135 active positives and 5 deaths.
 - Has 151 incarcerated adults COVID-19 active positive, 4,218 recovered and 76 deaths, 15,704 total tested.
 - Has staff and/or inmate COVID-19 positives in 28 of the 28 institutions – the last institution experienced a staff positive on June 21, 2020.
 - OSHP perimeter assistance at Trumbull Correctional Institution began June 29th.
 - ONG 6 medics 1 OIC begin at TCI effective today, July 1st.
 - Continues to have hot spots with staff and inmate positive COVID-19, most of the hot spot institutions reflect the hot spots (counties) in the State of Ohio.

14 | Recovery & Mitigation

- Ohio Emergency Management Agency
 - The FEMA Public Assistance (PA) Program is declared for COVID-19.
 - There are currently 720 applicants, an increase of 1 from July 6.
 - There are currently 70 projects submitted, an increase of 1 from July 6.
 - \$22.8 remains obligated.

15 | Public Affairs

- JIC
 - Actions Taken:*
 - There are two Pop-Up Testing Sites in Cincinnati today. Pop-up testing will continue daily in Hamilton County through Sunday, July 12.
 - The new ODH order mandating face coverings in public goes into effect at 6 pm, today. The mandate is for the seven Ohio counties designated as a Red Alert Level 3 – Public Health Emergency: Butler, Cuyahoga, Franklin, Hamilton, Huron, Montgomery and Trumbull.
 - Planned Actions:*
 - Support response as a need is identified.

Other Partners

- Ohio National Guard

Actions Taken:

- 509 guardsmen support 14 food bank missions.
- 2 Guardsmen are working as specialists in ODH labs.
- 246 members are on Specimen Collection teams.
- 7 Guardsmen are providing medical support at the Trumbull Correctional Institution.
- 20 soldiers support the state RSS warehouse. 24 Guardsmen operate the Expo Center warehouse.
- 948 Ohio National Guardsmen support the COVID-19 response in Ohio.

Planned Actions:

- The Ohio NG plans to perform sample collections at 25 locations in the next 24 hours.

- Ohio Homeland Security

Actions Taken:

- EPCS:
 - Currently there are 10,602 Active EPCS Credentials.
- OP3:
 - OP3 has a total of 1,919 members representing a total of 1,515 businesses.
 - Attended the Midwest Region state public-private partnership coordinators call.
 - Representatives from Illinois, Indiana, Minnesota, Michigan, Wisconsin and FEMA Reg 5 participated.
 - Assisted the Ohio Department of Health with an RFI by providing a contact with the Columbus Regional Airport Authority.
 - Continuing to work on an RFI with the EOC regarding supply chain status of PPE for medical offices, pharmacies and long term care facilities.
 - The following notification was sent to OP3 partners: Recommendations for Improving Building Ventilation Systems to Reduce Risk of Airborne COVID-19 Transmission.
- Critical Infrastructure:
 - Continuing to receive cancellations for SkyWatch Tower requests related to COVID-19 event cancellations and postponements.
 - The Emergency Support Function 14 (ESF-14) Cross-Sector Business and Infrastructure Partners Calls, concerning the non-medical side of COVID-19, have been very successful in creating a larger community-focused dialogue, performing issuing spotting, and unifying messages and efforts across public

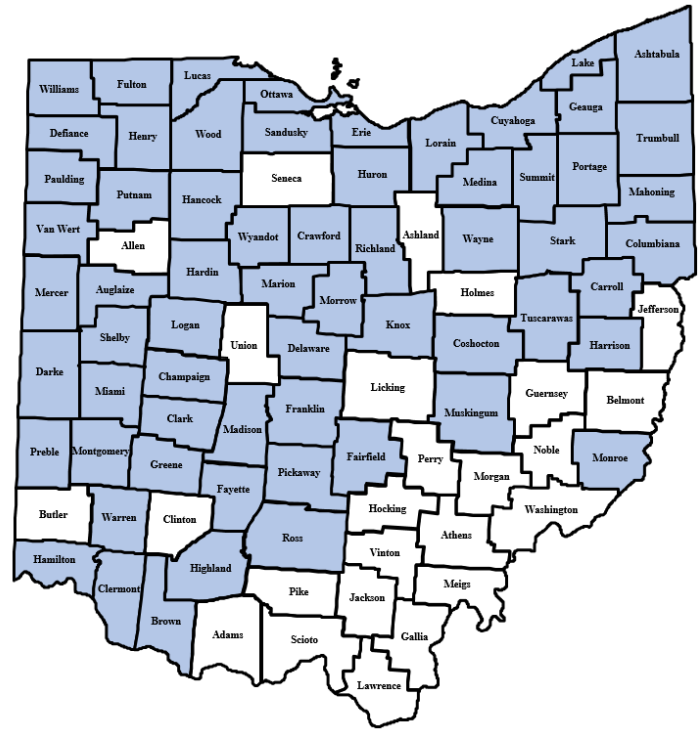
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and private critical infrastructure partners. The teleconference will continue to discuss critical infrastructure concerns and issues

- Grants & Strategic Planning:
 - Due to COVID-19 restrictions on travel and events, OHS had to modify existing grant related projects for cyber safety to conform to social distancing requirements.

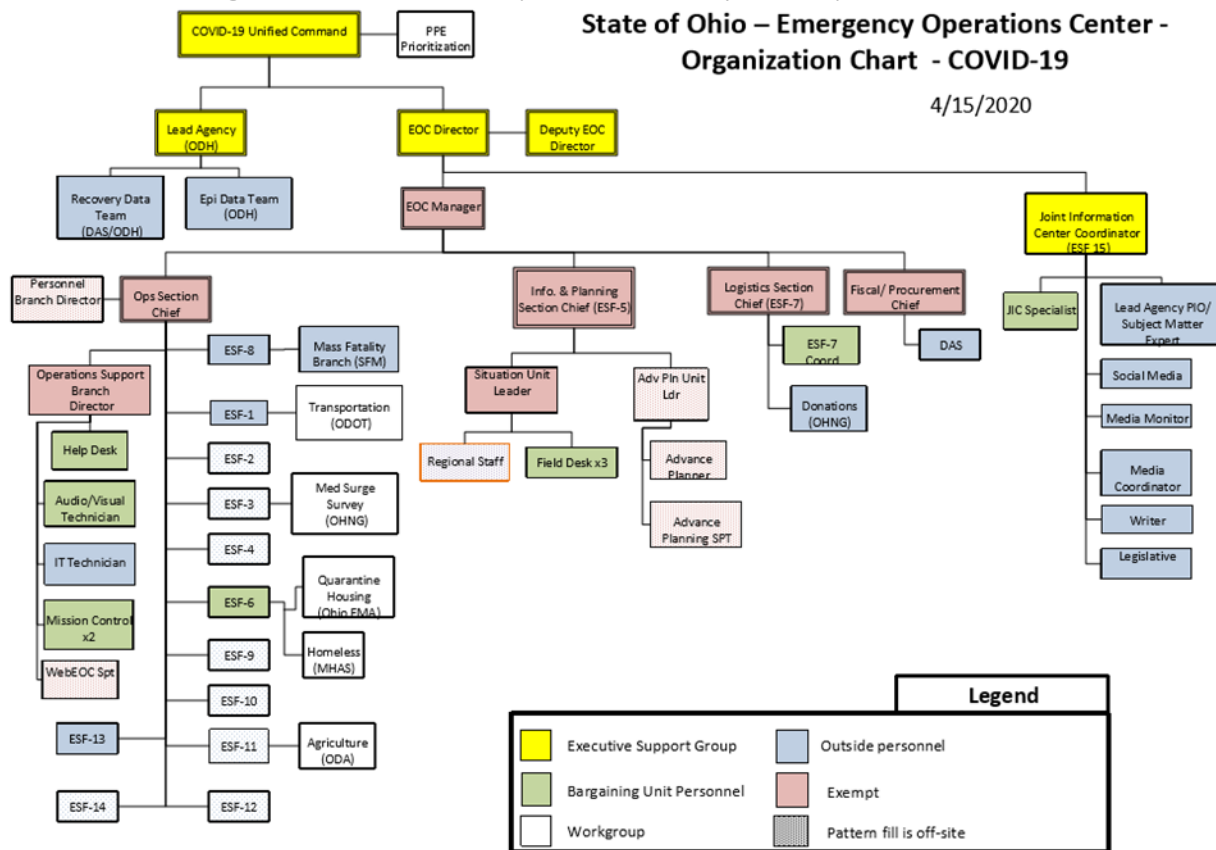
