Executive Summary

In the last 24 hours, the Ohio Department of Health reported 7,526 (682,570) total new cases, 52 (5,801) ICU admissions, 151 (8,722) deaths, and 560 (37,636) hospitalizations.

The next PPE push, which will consist of gloves and three-ply surgical masks is scheduled for January 11 and 13th, 2021.

The State EOC is currently at Partial Activation as it continues to coordinate response to COVID-19.

While the EOC is available for use by all Emergency Support Functions, ESFs 1, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 13, 14, and 15 will remain activated for the ongoing response.

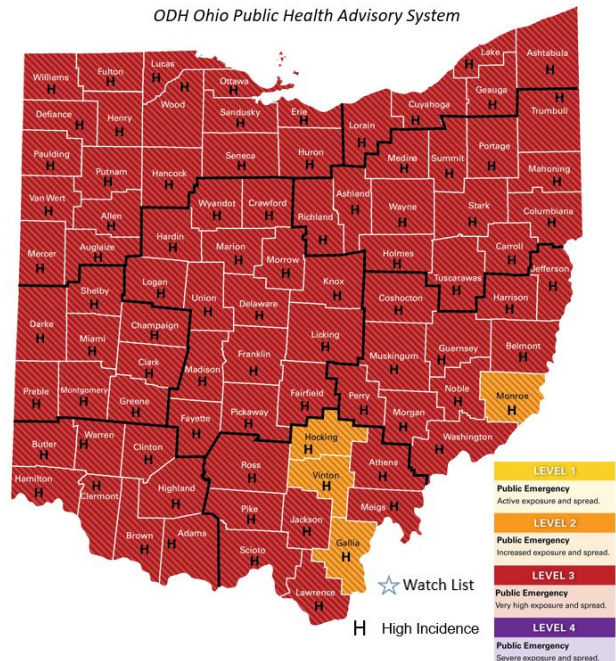

Primary Lifeline



- ODH reports an increase of key metrics (cases, hospitalizations, deaths)
- Three active RRF remain in-progress; 14 addressed and are no longer active
 - OHNG Title 32 support is scheduled to cease on March 31, 2021
 - Eight million nitrile gloves have been requested
 - Battelle CCDS funding is approved through March 31, 2021
- Medical Care: OHA reports multiple hospitals nearing capacity
- Public Health:
 - Available COVID-19 vaccinations are being administered per the state's [Vaccination Program](#)
 - Title 32 OHNG personnel are supporting sample collection and ODH labs
- Medical Supply Chain: Title 32 OHNG personnel are supporting the RSS and Adelaide Warehouses
- Fatality Management: ODH assets are deployed and pre-staged to support County EMA needs



- Food: Title 32 OHNG personnel are providing support to Ohio-based food banks
- Shelter: Non-congregate sheltering planning and response continues

 - Homelessness workgroup continues to collaborate on response



- Law Enforcement/Safety:
 - ODRC staff and incarcerated populations continue to test positive across statewide facilities
 - State Active Duty OHNG members are providing staffing support to select ODRC facilities

 - Zone 1 COVID positive inpatient census is down 450 patients from the zone 1 high of 2823 on December 1st. COVID positive patient
 - census in the ICU has also seen a decrease of 136 patients from the zone 1 high of 708 on December 15th.
 - -Staffing shortages have remained persistent throughout the month of December in zone 1 with the NW Region reporting the most
 - critical need with 46% of its hospitals indicating anticipated shortages of nurse staffing.
 - As of 29 Dec, The State of Ohio/ODH has filled four (4) hospital requests for 32 ventilator kits total.
 - There are no pending hospital requests for ventilator kits.
 - There are 648 State owned ventilator kits available.

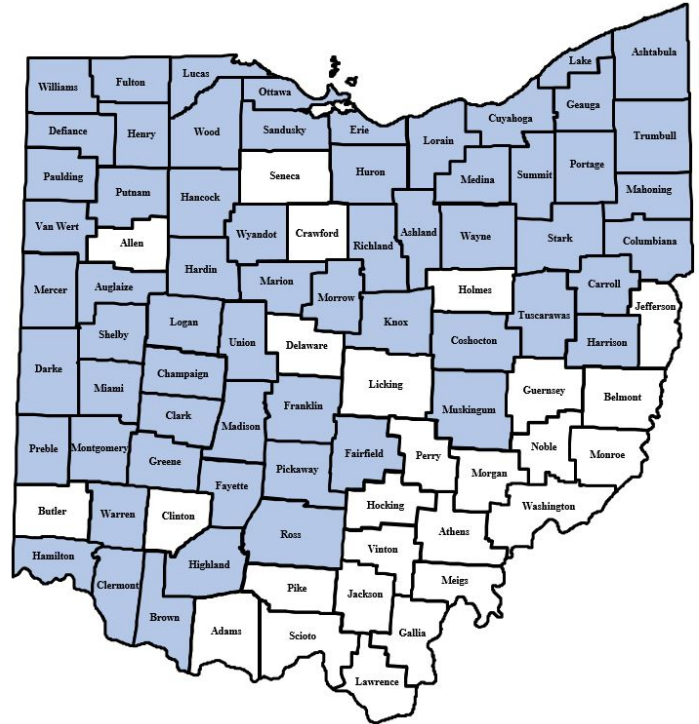
- Ohio National Guard

Actions Taken:

- Ohio National Guard continues to provide support to Ohio during the COVID-19 Pandemic with 12 active missions COVID-19 Sample Collection Support: One mission completed on December 28 in Union County Daily
- Average of samples collected to date vs forecasted is 70%. No Change since 14 December 2020.
- 308 ONG personnel work in 14 food banks around the State of Ohio.
- 2 specialists support the ODH Labs. 103 medical professionals are part of the sample collection teams. 40 personnel provided COVID sample courier services on behalf of the Dept of Medicaid.
- 34 pax are working in the RSS warehouse moving PPE.
- COVID-19 Sample Collection Support Mission: Two missions completed on December 29, with 1,100 projected samples. Specimen Courier Transportation Support Mission: 8,027 specimens projected for pick up on December 29 at 58 locations.

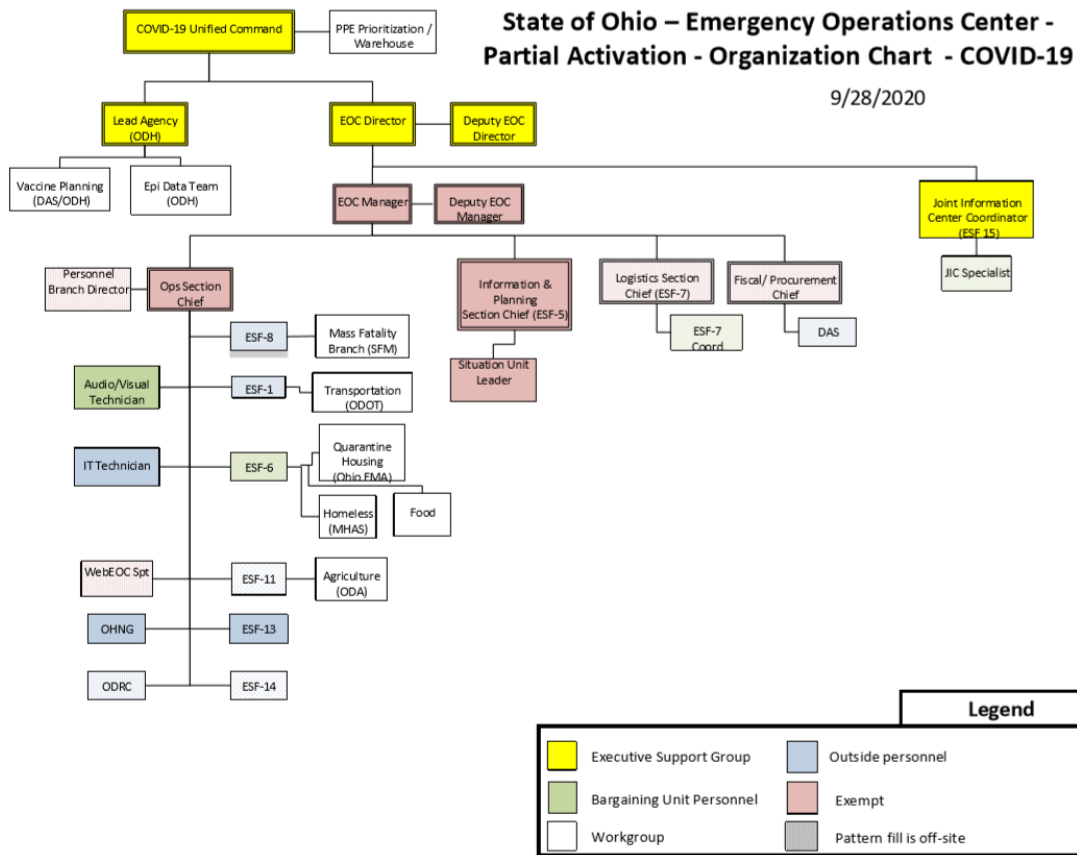
